How to register:

1. Log in to your ASC account on the website.
2. Go to acadiaseniorcollege.org/courses.
3. Review the class offerings.
4. Click  **Enroll** below the course description you are interested in. Please note that the Enroll link does not display until registration opens at 9:00 a.m.
5. Once you have enrolled in the class(es) you want, click the “Go to your cart” link in the upper right of the screen. This will take you to the Enrollments screen where you can choose to pay by credit card or by check.
6. You may register for more than one class before going to your cart. Tuition for the first course is \$60; additional courses are \$35 each. When registering online, you may pay with a credit card or choose to send a check.
7. If you choose to pay by check, we must receive your check within 7 days or we will offer your space to the next person on the waiting list.

Please read the following important information:

- You must be a current ASC member (or a member of another senior college) to register for courses. To join Acadia Senior College [click here](#). To renew your membership, [log in to your ASC account](#) and click the link in the upper right corner.
- Your membership must be active through the end of the term (March 14, 2025.)
- Registration is online at acadiaseniorcollege.org/courses.
- Registration is first come, first serve. Many courses fill quickly – there is no guarantee that there will be space available.
- If a course is full, we encourage you to join the waiting list. Spaces do open up sometimes, and in other cases the instructor may add students from the waiting list.
- Registration by phone or email will be only be processed beginning at 10:00 a.m. on November 20th (one hour after registration opens) as space permits.
- Phone assistance is very limited for the first two hours of registration – there is only one phone line and one person!
- If a class has assigned books, they will be available for pick up at Sherman's in Bar Harbor one to two weeks before the start of the term. We will notify you when they are available. Books and supplies are included in your course fee.
- **For Zoom classes with an assigned book, students who are out of the area will be responsible for purchasing their own book, but may request reimbursement from ASC. Local Zoom students may still pick up their books at Shermans. ASC does not mail books.**
- Registration requests received after December 2, 2024, may be honored with instructor approval. In these cases, students must purchase their own books, if applicable.
- As a courtesy, please let your instructor(s) know if you cannot attend a class session.

Instructor using a course credit? Contact ASC *before* registration so we can add a course credit to your account. When you register, the credit will be applied automatically on the checkout page. If you haven't contacted us before registration, go ahead and register online as usual and choose "Pay by check." Then contact the office to confirm your registration.

In-person classes

Please check course descriptions on the website for class locations. ASC follows the school (AOS91) cancellation policy. If school is cancelled, ASC classes will also be cancelled. In the event of a delay, classes that start within the delay period will also be cancelled. In some cases a class may move to Zoom or it may be rescheduled. Cancellation notices will be posted on our website and email notifications will be sent.

Zoom classes

Students registering for a Zoom class or hybrid Zoom section will receive the Zoom link the day before the first class session. The Zoom link is the same for all class sessions.

Hybrid classes

Hybrid classes offer two sections, one in-person and one Zoom, at the same time. Please register for one *or* the other. Plan to attend the section you have registered for. In the event of illness, unexpected travel, weather or other conditions students in an in-person section may request a Zoom link for a specific class.

Recording policy

Zoom and hybrid classes are recorded to allow students to make up a missed session or review material. Links to the recordings are sent to registered students by request only. The following permission is granted by those registering for a Zoom or hybrid course: “I grant permission for a recording or online streaming of this course that may include my image or voice and give permission for the use of such recording.” Recordings are for registered class students only – please do not share the links.
